

# BPI-Philam Odyssey Asia Pacific High Dividend Equity Fund Market Commentary

The MSCI AC Asia Pacific ex Japan index fell during the month. The US elections and the "higher for longer" rates expectations resulted in the markets falling. Returns across Asian markets were mostly negative, with Taiwan being the only market to appreciate. Taiwan saw inflows as third quarter results for many companies beat expectations. Robust Al demand also brought in inflows to the market. The bottom performing markets were India and China. The Indian market paused after strong year-to-date returns as valuations became more stretched and the earnings cycle showed signs of a slowing economy. Chinese markets pulled back following stimulus policy announcements, as investors awaited further developments after the US elections.


