Asian equities ended the month down in August after a two-month rally. Markets remained cautious over the month amid concerns on the outlook of China's economy weighing heavily. Sentiment weakened due to missed payments by Country Garden, a Chinese property developer but encouragingly, there was limited contagion into the broader financial system. The US dollar appreciated marginally. Greater China, Singapore and Philippines detracted the most. Wide sell-off in communication services and technology sector dragged the market in Singapore, while concerns over growth as GDP contracted over the last quarter affected the Philippine market


